

What reactions have your staff and volunteers had in response to your agency serving incarcerated survivors?





Roots of the Problem

- Fear of incarcerated people
- Negative media representation
- Rigidity around definition of a victim or survivor
- Sexual violence against incarcerated people not seen as "our problem"







Addressing Our Bias

- Necessary to unlearn messages we receive about incarcerated people
- Not always comfortable
- Essential to our work







We Have To Support All Survivors

- Necessary to reach ultimate goal of ending sexual violence
- Part of dismantling oppression
- Sexual abuse of incarcerated people is our problem


"...mission is to advocate for **all** victims and survivors of sexual assault and child sexual abuse."


