







IMPACTS OF YOUTH REGISTRATION



PSYCHOLOGICAL HARM

Stigmatization, isolation, depression, suicide.



EXPOSURE TO VIOLENCE

Vigilante violence; harassment and threats.



FAMILY HARM

Forced separation; children of registrants.



BARRIERS TO EMPLOYMENT

Professional licenses and certifications.



BARRIERS TO EDUCATION

Barred from attending schools.



HOUSING INSTABILITY

Restrictions on movement; homelessness.



ECONOMIC ISSUES

Fees and costs of registration.



CYCLES OF INCARCERATION

Lifetime involvement with criminal justice system



A child on the registry is a family on the registry, and often a victim on the registry.



ENGAGING HEARTS & MINDS

Ending youth registration is a piece of the larger movement to reach beyond punitive responses and toward lasting child sexual abuse prevention and healing.

- Reinvest in prevention, intervention, and treatment
- Shift the narrative and change the language
- Legislation to end registration
- Build coalitions




Ending youth registration frees \$3 billion to be redistributed across programs that work to end cycles of sexual harm.

Current youth registration practices are ineffective, expensive and harmful to community safety.

Eliminating the practice of labeling children as sex offenders allows us to reinvest in our youth, support victims and survivors of sexual harm, and enhances community safety.

UNITED STATES

Youth Registration Practices



In 40 states, children charged in juvenile court with sexual offenses can be subject to sex offender registration and notification restrictions.


- Non-Registration State

HOW YOUTH REGISTRATION WORKS: CALIFORNIA

- Lifetime for all registrants
- Began practice in 1986
- Not automatic
 - Must be adjudicated delinquent of a registerable sex offense
 - •And committed to Division of Juvenile Justice facility (houses 400 youth)

RACIAL DISPARITIES IN CALIFORNIA YOUTH SEX OFFENDER REGISTRATION



LIKELIHOOD OF YOUTH REGISTRATION BY RACE IN CALIFORNIA



In comparison to white youth...



Black youth are 6.5 times more likely



Native American youth are 2 times as likely



Samoan, Pacific Islander, Japanese, Hawaiian youth are 1.5 times as



Latino youth are equally likely

...to be on the California Sex Offender Registry

COSTS OF YOUTH REGISTRATION IN CALIFORNIA

- California spends \$140,000,000 annually to register youth
- 2017 State Budget only designates
 \$46,000 for victims services and prevention
