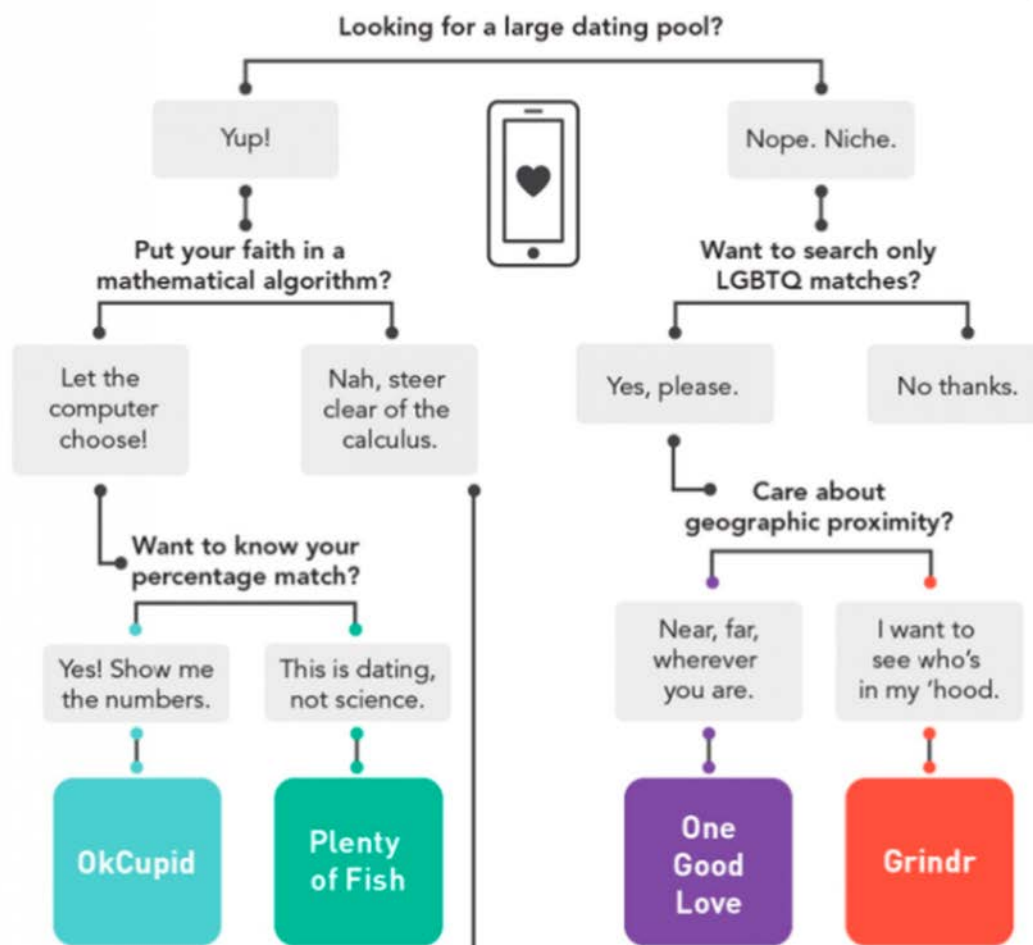


What does dating today look like?

- Over 30% of adults report using a dating app
 - 48% for 18-29 year olds
 - 38% for 30-49 year olds
 - 16% for 50+ year olds
 - Roughly 2x more for LGBTQ communities
- 10% report a serious committed relationship started from a dating app



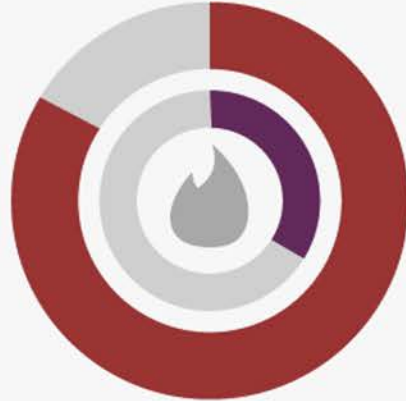

- Less social networking
- Less accountability
- More anonymous contacts
- Ability to manipulate online profiles
- Less informal forms of vetting



Catfishing

Catfishing is a deceptive activity where a person creates a sockpuppet presence or fake identity on a social networking service, usually targeting a specific victim for abuse or fraud.



Sextortion

Sextortion involves blackmail or coercion with the purpose of extorting sexually explicit images, messages, money or sexual favors from another person online.

- 37% report unwanted contact
- 35% were sent a sexually explicit message or image they didn't ask for
- 30% called an offensive name
- 10% threatened to physically harm
- Young women report highest levels of abuse/harassment
- Increased reported abuse for those who identify as LGBTQ
- 28.1% of teens report they had been subjected to a form of online dating abuse over the past year

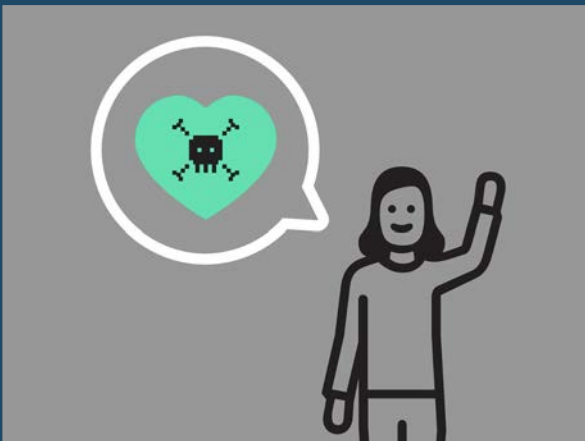

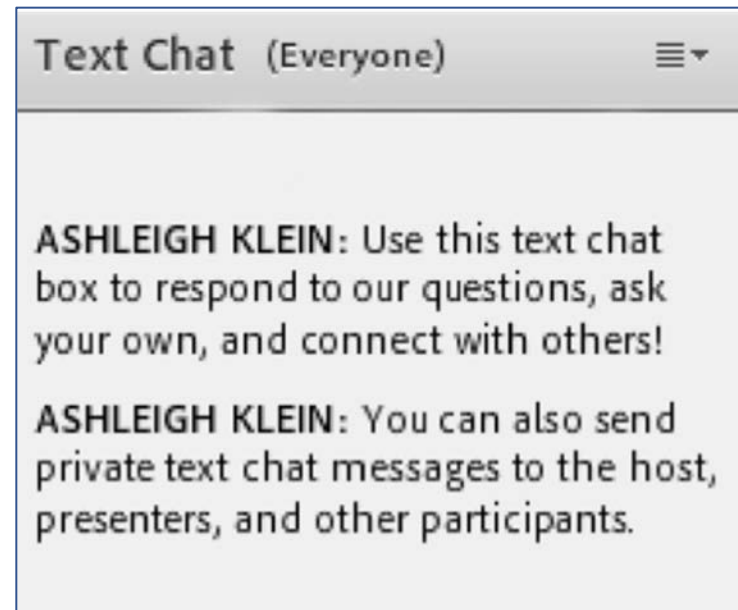
The use of dating ‘apps’ to facilitate real-world social encounters between strangers is culturally mainstream. Sexual assaults facilitated following dating-app meetings have been reported in the media, and anecdotally noted at increasing frequency by clinical forensic physicians. Limited empirical data suggests there has been a marked increase in real life sexual offences facilitated in this manner. There is little additional information known about the circumstances of these alleged incidents. This retrospective audit of a small forensic examination caseload from an Australian metropolitan clinical forensic medicine service identified that 14% (11 of 76) of alleged sexual assaults where complainants underwent a

Dating Apps and Reporting

- Tinder has a panic button that sends user location to emergency services
- Look for “Terms of Service” or “Community Guidelines” or “Safety” on the website
- Understand the blocking and safety checks for the app/site
- Can always report to law enforcement if wanted

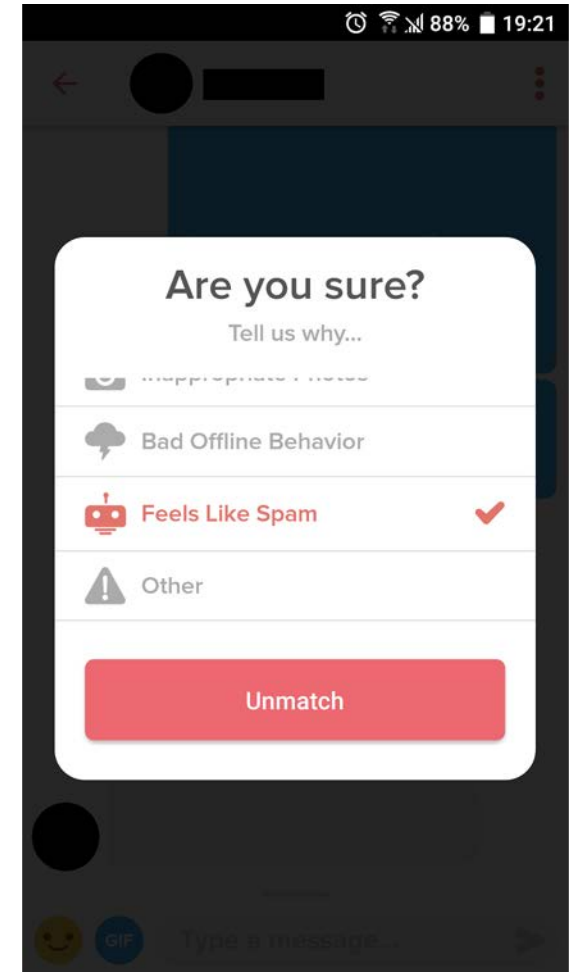

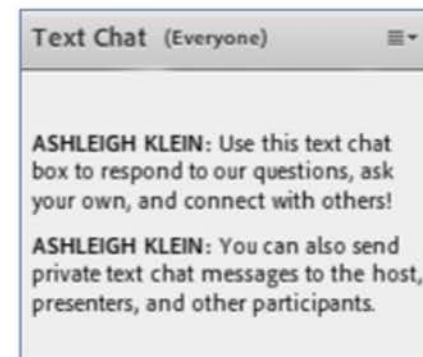
