



- Partnerships strengthen our connection to the broader community






COVID-19 and campus closures have magnified housing security issues for students.

Undergraduate women experienced nonconsensual sexual contact (AAU, 2019, 22 colleges)

7%

Undergraduate men experienced nonconsensual sexual contact (AAU, 2019, 22 colleges)

23%

Undergraduate transgender/gender queer/nonbinary students experienced nonconsensual sexual contact

# Sexual Assault on College Campuses


# What is Community?

## Collaboration IS a trauma-informed practice


- Diversity of expertise, experience, voice, and identity
- Being trauma-informed requires choices
- Collaboration uplifts the various sides of survivorship and complexities of trauma





#### **UM-Flint Sexual Violence Response and Resources**

If you have experienced, witnessed or know about an incident involving sexual violence (sexual assault, sexual harassment, intimate partner violence and stalking) at any point, you have many options to talk to someone and access resources both on and off campus. Choosing one route does not exclude other options. You may decide whatever will be most helpful for you.

- Show up for each other --- and survivors


