Sexual Assault on College Campuses

“...a group with diverse characteristics who are linked by social ties, share common perspectives, and engage in joint action in geographical locations or settings.”

3-Pronged Approach to Effectively Address and Prevent Sexual Violence on College Campuses



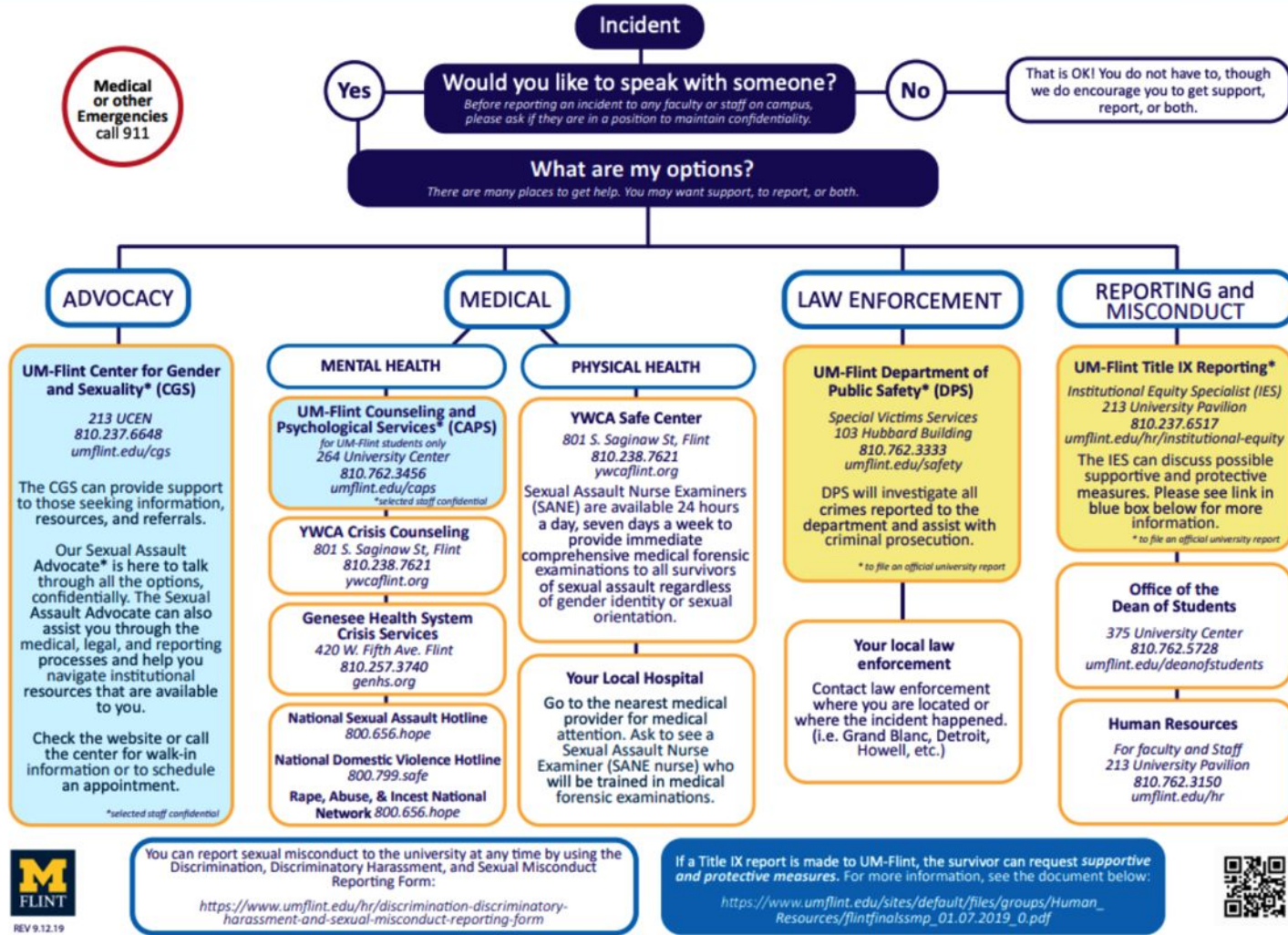
Collaboration IS a trauma-informed practice

- Diversity of expertise, experience, voice, and identity
- Being trauma-informed requires choices
- Collaboration uplifts the various sides of survivorship and complexities of trauma

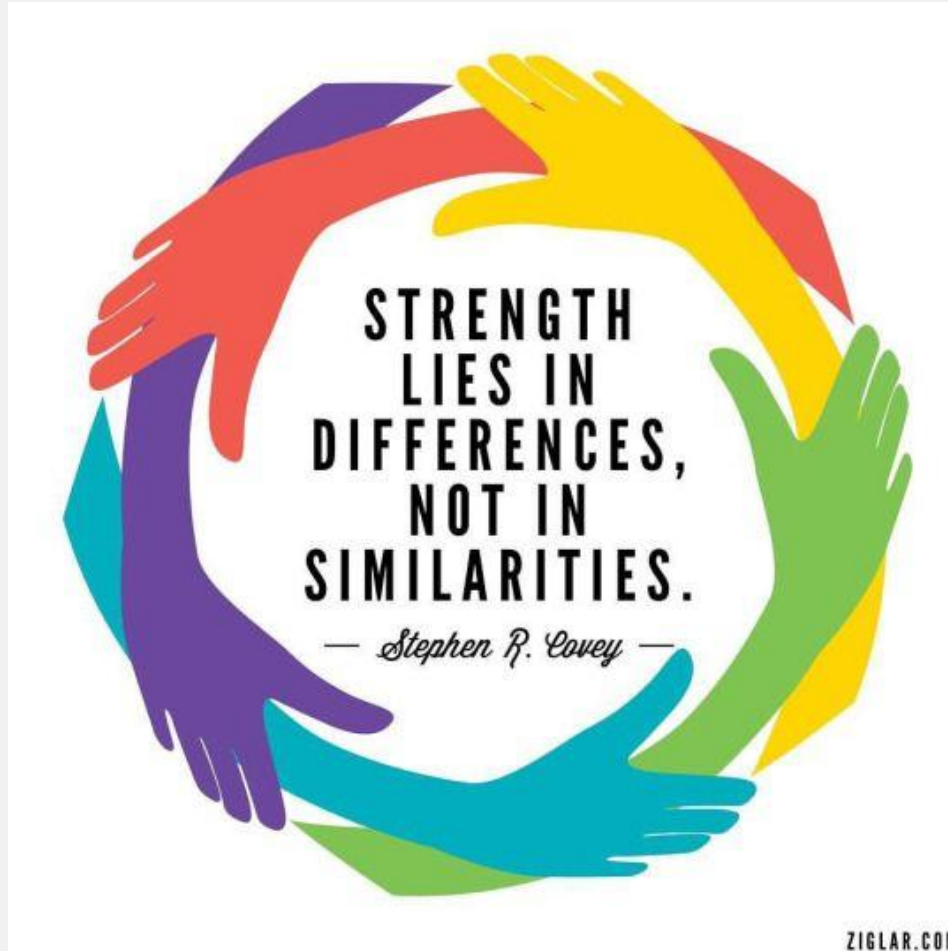


UM-Flint Sexual Violence Response and Resources

If you have experienced, witnessed or know about an incident involving sexual violence (sexual assault, sexual harassment, intimate partner violence and stalking) at any point, you have many options to talk to someone and access resources both on and off campus. Choosing one route does not exclude other options. You may decide whatever will be most helpful for you.



Coordinated Community Response Teams (CCRT)



CCRTs require durable relationships

- Active, ongoing communication
- Clarity of roles and responsibilities
- Traditions, appreciations, celebrations
- Commitment to resolve conflicts positively
- Intentionality
- Respect
